Unit: Digital Photography with PhotoShop	
Project: Me and Me Both	Level: 6, 7, 8 grade
Objectives:	Procedures:
 Student will use Photoshop to combine two or more images seamlessly Students will learn proper use of networks to save and manage files. Students will learn to use Photoshop tools: Layers, Paint brush and bucket. 	Class time needed: At least 1 day in the classroom to discuss and prepare, then 1-2 (40 minute) class periods in the computer lab. BEFORE lesson: Have students work in pairs or small groups to take pictures then save to a folder that the kids can access. Print out copies of the step-by-step directions. If working with MANY classes, print one class set and put in plastic page protectors (or Laminate) for repeated use.
Materials & Preparation:	Day One:
 Digital images of Students' in positions that will allow the student to appear interacting with oneself. Photoshop (Elements) color printer (try printing images on card stock or photo paper) 	 Review or create student rubric and requirements for finished product. Show slides of artists' work that reflects the ideas you want to focus on in this lesson. (surrealism connection) Discuss the art concept of surrealism and how this lesson would fit that concept. (interpersonal connection) Discuss families and siblings. Ask students if they ever wished they had a
Instructional Resources:	twin and why. Discuss what it means to interact with another person and brainstorm ways to interact with
Vocabulary:	 yourself as a twin. Have students work in pairs or small groups to take pictures. Depending on your number of cameras, this part may take more than one day. Allow students to act out several different poses/situations in order to have many options in the computer lab. If possible allow options in the hallway, outdoors, in an office or other areas that can provide a stable background. USE A TRI-POD!
JPEG, Browse, Network, Edit, Copy,	Day Two:
Layer, interaction, surrealism, repetition	 On a projector demonstrate the entire process, have the students follow along with the handout. Clearly describe the necessary steps for finding and saving files on your particular network with the "Browse for Files" feature in PhotoShop. If necessary create a handout or write on the board for kids to reference. Have kids use the handout to work on their own to create and save at least one Digital Painting. Day Three/Four: Additional Work time for students to
	finish pictures.
	EALRS:
Advanced students might combine three and four images to create a more complex situation.	Arts 1: The student understands and applies arts knowledge and skills.
